

Current text in the Statues, paragraph 17.2:

17.2 The Governing Board shall be composed of at least 6 and at most 15 directors, all-natural persons, representing full member - legal entities of the Association, elected by the General Meeting as determined hereafter.

The General Meeting elects at least one and at most three vice-chairs, for a term of office of three years, according to the following procedures:

- The General Meeting firstly elects the directors.
- The General Meeting next elects the co-chairs on the basis of an application by the elected directors. A member not elected as director may not stand for election as co-chair or vice-chair. The General Meeting elects the directors according to the following procedures: these directors will be chosen for a term of office of three years from among the candidates from the Association's full members that obtain the greatest number of votes. If several candidates obtain an equal number of votes, subsequent additional votes will be taken if the number of positions to be filled is insufficient.
- The Governing Board proposes the number of co-chairs and vice-chairs for the current period.
- The co-chairs are elected first.
- The vice-chairs are elected next.

If several candidates obtain an equal number of votes, subsequent additional votes will be taken.

Suggested text the Statues, paragraph 17.2:

17.2 The Governing Board shall be composed of at least 6 and at most 15 directors, all-natural persons, representing full member - legal entities of the Association, elected by the General Meeting as determined hereafter.

The General Meeting elects the Governing Board according to the following procedures:

- The General Meeting firstly elects the directors for a term of office of two years, where half of the Governing Board directors are elected each year, from among the candidates from the Association's full members that obtain the greatest number of votes. If several candidates obtain an equal number of votes, subsequent additional votes will be taken if the number of positions to be filled is insufficient.
- The Governing Board proposes the number of co-chairs and vice-chairs for the current period.
- The General Meeting elects at least one and at most three co-chairs, for a term of office of two years, where at least one of co-chair is elected each year in case there are two co-chairs, on the basis of an application by the elected Governing Board directors. A member not elected as director may not stand for election as co-chair. The co-chairs candidates from the Governing Board that obtain the greatest number of votes becomes the co-chairs. If several candidates obtain an equal number of votes, subsequent additional votes will be taken if the number of positions to be filled is insufficient.
- The General Meeting elects at least one and at most three vice-chairs, for a term of office of two years, where at least one of vice-chair is elected each year in case there are two vice-chairs, on the basis of an application by the elected Governing Board directors. A member not elected as director may not stand for election as vice-chair. The vice-chair candidate(s) from the Governing Board that obtain the greatest number of votes becomes the vice-chair(s). If several candidates obtain an equal number of votes, subsequent additional votes will be taken if the number of positions to be filled is insufficient.
